Keep Leaves Out of the Street

Check out these tips from the City of Minneapolis on fall leaves:

- Residents shouldn't rake their leaves and other debris into city streets – it's harmful to our lakes and waterways and it's against the law (Title 17, § 427.270 of the Minneapolis Code).
- Decomposing leaves on streets and sidewalks can wash into storm drains and eventually end up in Minneapolis' lakes, streams and the Mississippi River. Leaves over-fertilize lake water and encourage harmful aquatic plants and algae to thrive. The result is murky lake water that isn't good for swimming and fishing and which harms wildlife.
- Collect and bag leaves and other yard waste and place it by your regular recycling and garbage containers for city crews to haul. Visit minneapolismn.gov/solid-waste/yardwaste/ for more information or call 612-673-2917.

Washburn Winter Wonderland

If you saw the 5500 block of Washburn Ave S after the sun set last winter, you'll remember the magical holiday lights stretching down the boulevards. We've got the details from Armatage neighbor, Jess Bell, and posted her light hanging tips at armatage.org/lights!

What inspired you and how did the project come together?

When my husband Aaron and I lived in San Diego, a nearby neighborhood strung lights along their boulevards creating a magical experience and beautiful representation of community.

When we moved back to MN, I proposed the idea to our new neighbors. We came together on a Sunday afternoon in Nov to hang wire and lights between the trees along the boulevard. By the time the sun had set, both sides of the block were lined with lights.

What has been the impact?

We have a truly awesome group of neighbors here. The lights remind us of our community and connection during a time of year when we see less of one another. Walking down our street on a cold winter night certainly brings me joy and I'm not alone. People drive down our block because something as simple as stringing strands of lights along a boulevard transforms the block into something magical. It is a visual representation of our connection.

What advice would you give to other blocks?

Pick a date to gather neighbors and get cables and lights hung! Utilize peoples' strengths. Each neighbor is responsible for providing and powering their own lights. There are no rules for when to turn them on and off.

Don't get hung up on the little details, it's a process that will improve and work itself out over time. Also, if you try this year with minimal results, try again next year. Momentum will build, I promise.



What motivates you?


I am motivated by the opportunity to have a positive impact on the lives of my neighbors by working on programs that will benefit the community.

Air Leaks? Borrow the New Thermal Camera

As the weather gets colder, we all feel the drafts and air leaks at our homes, rentals and businesses a bit more.

Thanks to a new project in the neighborhood led by Armatage resident Milo Oien-Rochat, you can check out a thermal camera to pinpoint temperature-related energy waste in your home, business, or apartment. You'll get accurate information and helpful

ideas to make easy energy improvements in your space.

HOW IT WORKS:

- Sign up to check out the thermal camera for a week at **armatage.org/camera**
- Look for an email to schedule a quick training at the Armatage Rec Center, put down a refundable \$100 deposit, and pick up the camera.
- After taking images of your space, bring the camera back for your deposit and get resources to use what you learned to make energy upgrades.
